SUJET N°5 : The Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza

The Ritz-Carlton, Dallas


3. Make a presentation of the museum and give details about the visit you have organized for tomorrow on Tuesday (mention different possibilities of the visit)

The Museum is located on the sixth and seventh floors of an early 20th-century warehouse formerly known as the [Texas School Book Depository](#). The [permanent exhibit](#) features films, photographs and artifacts that chronicle President Kennedy's life, death and legacy. Temporary exhibits can be seen on the [seventh floor](#). The Museum offers monthly [programs](#), special events and [educational resources](#). While you're here, we invite you to visit both [Museum Stores](#) and to explore the [Reading Room](#), the Museum's extensive library of books, audiovisual resources and artifacts. The Museum is open Monday 12 p.m. - 6 p.m.; Tuesday - Sunday 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. Free [audio guides](#) are included with exhibit admission and are available in English, Spanish, German, French, Portuguese, Japanese and a Family version (English only).



Mission Statement

The Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza chronicles the assassination and legacy of President John F. Kennedy; interprets the Dealey Plaza National Historic Landmark District and the John F. Kennedy Memorial Plaza; and presents contemporary culture within the context of presidential history.

Constructed in 1901, the red brick building on the corner of Houston and Elm streets was known as the Texas School Book Depository at the time of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. The private firm stocked and distributed textbooks for public schools in north Texas and parts of Oklahoma.

On President's Day 1989, The Sixth Floor Museum opened as a response to the many visitors who come to Dealey Plaza to learn more about the assassination. The historical exhibition on the sixth floor highlights the impact of Kennedy's death on the nation and the world. Two key evidentiary areas on the sixth floor have been restored to their 1963 appearance.

On President's Day 2002, the Museum opened the seventh floor gallery. This flexible space now provides an additional 5,500 square feet for innovative exhibitions, special events and public programming.

In July 2010, the Museum opened the Reading Room—a reflective environment for anyone seeking information and understanding about the assassination and legacy of President John F. Kennedy. The Reading Room directly overlooks Dealey Plaza and provides researchers, educators and students with access to an extensive library which includes books, magazines and newspapers and covers topics ranging from Kennedy's life and legacy to conspiracy theories and 1960s pop culture.

Audio Guides

Audio guides are included with museum admission. The guide features excerpts of historic radio broadcasts and the voices of reporters, police officers and witnesses to the assassination. Audio guides are available in English, Spanish, German, Portuguese, French, Japanese and a Family version (English only).

Shopping and Dining

The [Museum Store + Café](#) is located at 501 Elm across the street from the Museum and offers works by local artisans, distinctive pop culture products inspired by the 1960s, newly published books and documentaries and special gift items. In the Café guests can enjoy espresso drinks, smoothies, frozen yogurt and a changing daily selection of locally sourced breakfast pastries, sandwiches and sweet treats. The Museum Store + Café is open to the public daily, 9:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

The Museum Bookstore is located in The Sixth Floor Museum Visitors Center. It features a variety of books, T-shirts and souvenirs and is open during Museum hours.

The Museum is wheelchair accessible and exhibit materials are available for visually or hearing impaired guests. Please ask for more information in our Visitors Center.


